


Tonino Zaccagnini September 9, 1967—June 16, 2023

You Asked-LOLA Response to Member Question:

The following question was asked by one of our LOLA members:

"Other than the buoy program, what else does LOLA do to protect the lake? (example: Control of boats illegally being kept by non-residence on the lake.)" Thanks for being a LOLA member and taking the time to ask about what LOLA does in the message box on your membership form. You mentioned the buoy program in your note, so I know you're familiar with that activity. You also mentioned concern for boats being illegally kept by non-residents on the lake. Let me first respond to that concern. We've been working with our local DNR conservation officer on the "keyholing". We were told that if we identified suspected non-resident docking, he would investigate. This has not been successful to date. We have a new DNR conservation officer beginning this season, and we will again take this up with him. We have been told that lake residents can report this directly to the DNR by using the Report all Poaching link on the DNR website. In addition, we (the LOLA board) met with the Lake Orion Village Manager Darwin McClary and Orion Township Supervisor Chris Barnett on April 5 of last year to address this concern specifically. We prepared and presented ordinance changes that would help enable enforcement. Although we weren't specifically turned down, it was clear roadblocks exist that we'll continue to work. I've attached the presentation we made at that meeting for reference. We intend to continue working this issue, recognizing this is an uphill battle. We have also met with our local low enforcement officials expressing our lake

overcrowding concerns and overall safety. We left that meeting with several followups that we're working on this boating season.

Another important LOLA function are the multiple lake water samples taken during the season. These samples are then submitted to the Michigan DNR and analyzed, with results posted on the DNR website with many of the other Michigan inland lakes. There are also the activities we either organize or support associated with the annual Dragon On The Lake weekend. We organize and run the Lighted Boat Parade on Friday night of that weekend, and we support the races with safety patrol boats at the racecourse on both race days. One of our goals last year and again this year is trying to build membership. There are over 800 lakefront properties on the lake, and our membership last year was only around 150. We are aggressively trying to build that number. As you can imagine, when we approach the Village Council or the Township Board about an issue (such as illegal docks), we don't carry the same clout with 150 members out of 800 as we would with 800 out of 800 members.
